WATERLOO TOWNSHIP

ORDINANCE NO. 96-05-21-1

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE HEREBY RESOLVED to adopt an Ordinance to regulate hours of minors in public, parental responsibility regarding hours of minors in public, to prohibit the aiding and abetting of violations of this Ordinance, and to prescribe penalties for the violation thereof.

THE TOWNSHIP OF WATERLOO, COUNTY OF JACKSON, STATE OF MICHIGAN, ORDAINS;

Sec. 1. CURFEW.

No minor under the age of seventeen (17) years shall be or remain in or upon any of the streets, alleys or public places in the Township of Waterloo between the hours of 11:00 o'clock P.M. of any day and 6:00 A.M. of the day following unless that person is accompanied by a parent, guardian, or other persons having the care and custody of such minor, or unless the employment permitted by Michigan . State Law of such minor makes it necessary that such minor person be in or upon said streets, alleys or public places during the hours herein before stated.

Any minor violating the provisions of this Section shall be deemed a delinquent child and may be complained against to the Probate Court of the County of Jackson.

Sec. 2. PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY.

No parent, guardian or other adult person having duly care and custody of any minor child under the age of 17 years shall allow or permit any such child, ward or other person, while in his legal custody, to go, or be in or upon any of the streets, alleys or public places of the Township of Waterloo at any time prohibited by Section 1 unless there exists a reasonable necessity thereof. Any parent, guardian or other adult person having the legal care and custody of any minor under the age of 17 years who violates the provisions of this Section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to the penalties prescribed therefor by the Township of Waterloo.

Sec. 3. PENALTY.

Every person convicted of any violation of any provision of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days or both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 4 PRIOR ORDINANCES.

All ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall become effective June 28, 1996.
